

Lesson Plan 4 How to Document the Story of a Heritage Building

























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Title of Lesson: Data Collection Using Building Recording Forms



Description

This activity acts as a tool to help students learn how to collect data through the use of recording forms. The teacher introduces the students to recording forms as a way to gather data in the context of architectural heritage documentation. The students will use the recording forms to collect data related to their school building or from a building that is located close to their school.



Learning Objectives

Students will be able to:

- Value the architectural heritage documentation procedure.
- Explain the structure and the content of a building recording form.
- Use the building recording forms.

Related curricular subject(s)

- Primary: History
- Secondary: All subjects related to data collection

Primary school students (9 to 12 years old)

Prerequisites and preparatory actions for teachers

Prerequisites and preparatory actions for students

Step by step description of the tasks

- Step 1: The teacher introduces the students to the building recording form as a method for data collection related to architectural heritage (15 mins).
- Step 2: Divide the students into groups of five (also subject to the size of the class) (5 mins).
- Step 3: The students go outside and work in their groups to complete the
 form. Examples of buildings to explore include a building in the
 neighbourhood near the school and/or any other architectural heritage
 building close to their school (30 mins).
- Step 4: General discussion that includes: 1) Students sharing the results with
 the rest of the classroom 2) their conclusions regarding the building they
 studied 3) the usefulness and/or limitations of building recording forms and
 4) students share the results with the rest of the classroom and their
 conclusions (15 mins).





• Step 5: Each group presents their work (5 mins per group).

Evaluation and feedback

 The teacher assesses whether the students understood how to complete the recording form based on each group's presentation of the data they collected.
